**Rev Tor's 14th Annual Dead of Winter Jam  
Returns to The Colonial Theatre  
Celebrating the Music and Enduring Spirit  
of Bob Weir and the Grateful Dead**

**PITTSFIELD, MA** — Berkshire Theatre Group (BTG) and Artistic Director, CEO Kate Maguire are pleased to present **Rev Tor's 14th Annual Dead of Winter Jam**, a longtime mid-winter tradition celebrating the music, spirit and influence of Bob Weir and The Grateful Dead, on Saturday, February 7 at 7:30pm at The Colonial Theatre.

As a founding member and creative cornerstone of the Grateful Dead, Bob Weir's songwriting, rhythm guitar style and musical vision helped define a band whose influence continues more than six decades later. Hosted by Dead Man's Waltz & Friends, this year's Dead of Winter Jam honors 61 years of Grateful Dead music, with special attention to the songs, collaborations and improvisational spirit that Weir brought to the stage.

The evening features special guest performances by Hayley Jane, Mark Mercier, Max Chase and Mike "Woody" Wood, uniting standout musicians from the Northeast jam and festival scene for a night rooted in collaboration and musical exploration.

Interweaving classic songs with extended improvisation, Dead Man's Waltz brings a deep respect for Bob Weir's body of work and the Grateful Dead catalog while offering a fresh, dynamic interpretation that captures the freedom and communal energy at the heart of the music. The result is a celebratory concert experience that honors Weir's enduring influence on American rock and live performance culture.

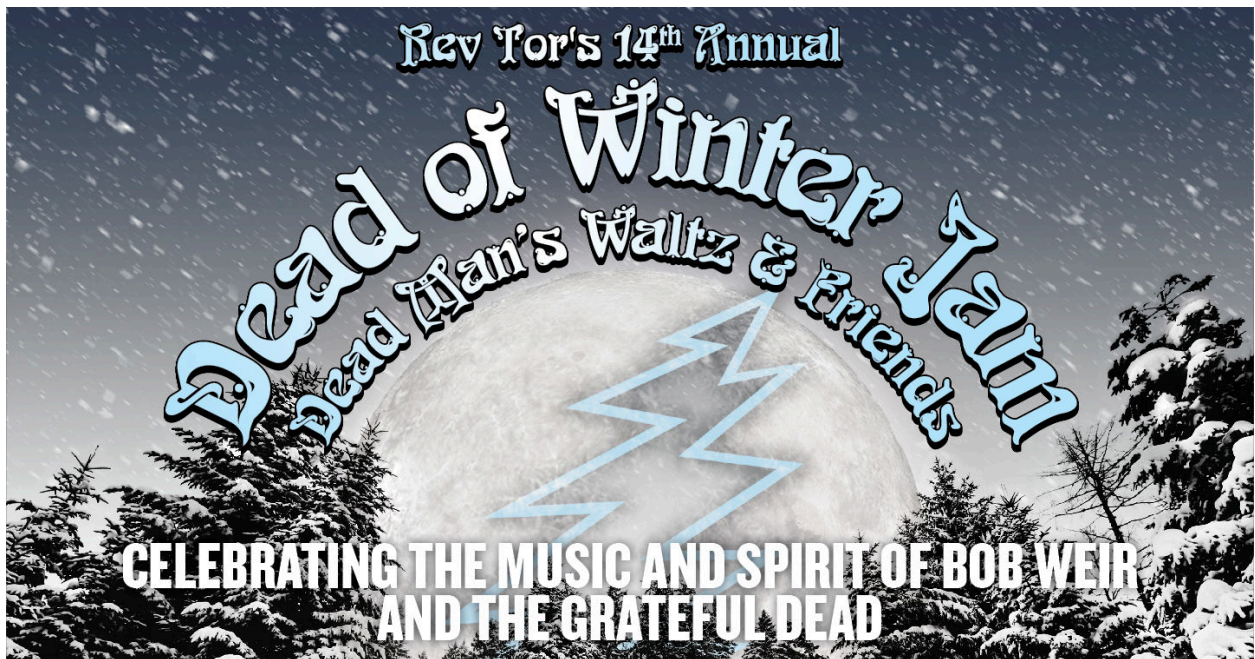

The Colonial Theatre, founded in 1903, and Berkshire Theatre Festival, founded in 1928, are two of the oldest cultural organizations in the Berkshires. In 2010, under the leadership of Artistic Director and CEO Kate Maguire, the two organizations merged to form Berkshire Theatre Group (BTG). Berkshire Theatre Group's mission is to support wide ranging artistic exploration and acclaimed performances in theatre, dance, music and entertainment. Every year, BTG produces and presents performances to over 68,000 attendees and, through our Educational Program, serves over 10,000 Berkshire County school children annually. In July 2020, Berkshire Theatre was the first company in the United States to earn approval from Actors' Equity Association to produce a musical (*Godspell*) in the wake of the COVID-19 Pandemic. In 2028, Berkshire Theatre Group will celebrate 100 years of theatre.
